QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR WEDDING PLANNER

When do your services start?	TIP: This is particularly important if you choose a "day of" coordinator or "wedding management." Some "day of "coordinators won't start working with you until 60 days before your wedding, even though you've booked them 12 months in advance. If you want to work with your planner for your full engagement, you need a "full planning" package or a planner who is willing to communicate the entire length of your engagement even though you've only hired them to do "day of" coordination.
